### **JUNIOR CLASSROOM**





I hope that all students had a wonderful break over the school holidays and are ready for another busy term!

In the Junior class this week, students will be continuing their spelling programs working on their phonological awareness skills of reading sounds and words. They will be completing assessments for their writing, spelling and reading this week. These assessments assist in my planning for their work for the term and help determine areas for student improvement.

In maths students will be completing short activities number sense skills and understanding, as well completing as assessments again to assist in planning and student achievement. Each afternoon this week students will be learning all about Geography, History, and culture of France and the Olympics that will be held there in July and August this year.





Across the next term, the Juniors will have many opportunities for new and exciting learning opportunities. They will be completing a dance unit with the lovely Mrs Johnson and getting ready for the 2024 Eisteddfod. They will also complete an exciting science unit that will use their skills of art and data collection while they examine how the changes in the sky impact the environment.

Just a quick note for parents, I have adjusted how homework will run this term. I have provided every student with a homework book where students will glue their spelling lists and mathematics activities. I strongly encourage reading with students at home and you can record your books in the homework reading diary, also provided to students. Each student will be given a small book to practice for the week, this is to encourage students to be reading to others and practice their important decoding and comprehension skills.


# From the Senior Classroom

It's always exciting starting a new term. It provides opportunities to see exactly where students are at in their learning and set new goals to achieve. Several assessments will be carried out this week while students are immersed in their independent research and learning about the country of France. A Google Classroom task has been set and students will be creating digital books about France using the book creator app.

In English this term, we will be studying the English concept of genre by looking at two different styles of texts that examine the same content area – one factual and one imaginative. 'Iceberg,' is a CBCA Winner about an iceberg born into spring that travels through the seasons before dying in a new spring is a stunning, lyrical story from multi-award-winning picture book creators Claire Saxby and Jess Racklyeft. The other text we will use to study genre is 'Earth's Incredible Oceans.' Written by animal expert Jess French and illustrated by Claire McElfatrick, this book takes children on a fascinating underwater journey, showing them just how amazing oceans are, what plants and animals live in them, and how we can help them. It includes all sorts of ocean life, plus amazing facts on how ocean animals have fun, look after their young, and interact with each other.



All of our writing, grammar and reading comprehension activities will be linked to these two texts. In addition, and just because students in the senior class LOVE listening to me read stories, we will read a book purely for pleasure. Find out which one next week!



In Mathematics for the next two weeks, our focus will be on the big idea that – Questions can be asked and answered by collecting and interpreting data. Students will participate in many learning activities where they can collect and analyse data. They will look at the many ways data can be represented and which data is reliable.

Our KLA focus for weeks 2 and 3 will be History and students will continue our focus on celebrations and commemorations by looking at celebrations form other parts of the world. They will consider the 'Key Inquiry Question' How and why do people choose to remember significant events of the past?

Homework will start again in week 2.

We're in for a busy week!
