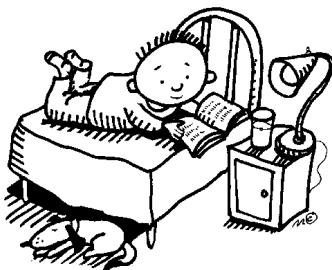
### P&C News

Please encourage and support them to complete homework at home. At the very least, students should be reading every night. Children who observe their parents reading are more likely to read themselves for pleasure. Try to find a quiet space for your child to sit to do their homework. Be on hand to offer help if asked but most work should be able to be completed independently.



Activities in English (including spelling) and Mathematics will be provided which mirror what is being taught in class each week. Although not compulsory, completing homework is a good habit to get into for your child.

It reinforces key skills and strategies which are taught at school and helps to prepare your child with routines which will benefit them once they move on to high school.



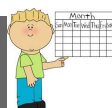
