## PBL Positive Behaviour for Learning

### SAFE, RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE

Students all know our key words and can explain what it means to be **safe, respectful and responsible** both in and out of the classroom.



This week our focus is on the playground areas, including the tennis court. Students will discuss the focus on Monday morning and revisit it several times throughout the week.

Students will be encouraged to agree to the rules of a game before playing so everyone knows what is expected. They will also talk about the importance of not getting involved in arguments that are not their business. This can often aggravate an issue rather than diffuse it. If students are not happy with something, they **MUST** seek the advice and support of an adult rather than try to intervene themselves. An adult at school can work with a group of students to discuss possible suggestions as to how the issue can be overcome.

#### SAFE

Stay in bounds, keep hands and feet to yourself, walk on all concrete areas, wear a hat.



#### RESPECTFUL

Play fairly and take turns, follow teacher instructions, speak politely, agree on game rules before you play.

#### RESPONSIBLE

Put rubbish in the bin, solve problems calmly together or ask an adult to help, sit during eating time, use equipment sensibly, report any problems to an adult, negotiate and agree the rules of games before you play, go to line up quickly after the bell.

Students who demonstrate the skills for the week will continue to be rewarded with green slips for our weekly draw.

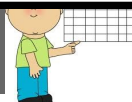
