My sincere thanks to **Miss Heraghty** and **Mr Boller** for giving up their time to attend with me. Without the dedication and commitment of staff to do these things, overnight excursions wouldn't happen.

My thanks also to **Mrs Battye** and **Deb Robinson** for holding the fort back at school, catching up with paperwork, updating the website, packing up the book fair, organising portfolio folders ready to fill, tidying and doing a stock check of the art store room etc. There are always so many jobs to be done outside of the daily teaching routines and never enough hours in the day to do them.

Again this week, students will continue to be reminded about being **safe**, **respectful** and **responsible**, before they enter the classroom and before they go out for recess and lunch.

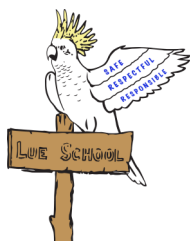

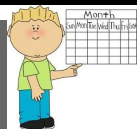
