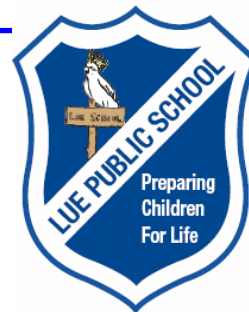

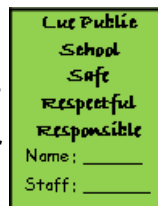
Permission note and information attached for the qualifying students.

This week our focus is on **TOILETS**. The toilet block is an area that can be overlooked when thinking about behaviour at school but is also an area that is often out of sight for staff and the temptation for silly behaviour can be difficult for some students to control.

Privacy is of paramount importance for students when using the toilet area and good hygiene skills need to be explicitly taught. Practising hand washing might seem trivial but can often make all the difference to containing outbreaks of bugs at school.

Students will discuss the focus on Monday morning and revisit it several times throughout the week.

Students are working hard to demonstrate the behaviours of being **safe, respectful and responsible** by practising the explicit skills below.

SAFE

One person in cubicle
Wash hands
Walk at all times
Keep food outside toilet area

RESPECTFUL

Follow adult instructions
Allow others privacy
Clean up after yourself
Speak politely

RESPONSIBLE

Report any problems to an adult
Use toilet paper, soap and taps correctly
Flush the toilet after use
Wait for friends outside
Use the toilet during lunch and recess
Return to class quickly after using the toilet during lesson time

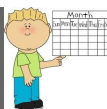
Our Busy Bee for this week is **Tyler Charters**.
