### School Canteen term 4

After a discussion with the P&C and staff, we have decided to offer parents a choice for next term. Parents can either pay upfront a fee of \$25 at the start of term to cover the cost of all Canteen lunches for the 10 weeks, a saving of \$15 if students have canteen lunch every week, or continue to pay the \$4 each week. Our 'student of the week' this week is **Amelia Murdoch**. Amelia loves to play in the sandpit and is learning how to be safe by not throwing sand.



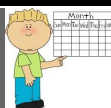
### Junior Class Busy Bee
