
Together Everyone Achieves More

Green Day enables students to learn about various environmental topics, eg issues associated with soil, water, biodiversity, sustainability and climate, and how they can make changes to the way they live. This year, 580 students from 14 schools will be participating in the event.



Each year Green Day has a different theme, and a special guest presenter. This year, Ruben Meerman, **a.k.a** the Surfing Scientist!, will be the keynote speaker.

The theme of this year's event is GoMAD, an acronym for Go Make A Difference. 


Junior Class Busy Bee
