




Please check at home to see if your child has any student of the week badges lying around. We had 12 and are now down to the last 2 so there are some that have been left at home. If you find them, please return them to school.

FROM THE JUNIOR CLASSROOM

ANOTHER PRODUCTIVE WEEK IN THE JUNIOR ROOM!

This week, we started our unit of work on art. We followed a directed drawing of a cartoon styled koala. Students then had to use their imaginations to decide what their background would look like. Many students chose to put their koalas in a gum tree, while others chose to put theirs near a river. We then used water colour pencils to colour in our works, then used water and a paint brush to turn the pencils to paint. Once they were dry, we used black and dark blue gel pens to go over our lines and add the finishing touches. I was impressed to see how well students concentrated and really took their time to include intricate details.

Our final session with Harry was a lot of fun! All students have improved their ball control , gross motor and teamwork skills. The juniors gave Harry a handmade card to thank Harry for coaching them and organising so many fun games!

Students have been completing a lot of tasks on computers lately to build their technology skills. All students can log in on their own and navigate familiar websites and programs. We have been working on making sure that we shut down the laptops correctly as well. All students are making sound progress on Typing Club and are becoming faster at typing which is an important skill to develop.

In Literacy, we are going to be finishing our unit on 'How to Catch a Star'. This unit has been a lot of fun and all students have enjoyed the story and learning about space.

FROM THE SENIOR GLASSROOM

This week, students in the senior class will complete their post spelling tests as we will be away next week. Most assessments are now completed and the data is being used to support Semester 2 report writing. During English lessons, students will finalise their pocket books and complete their digital versions using the book creator app. It's also time for students to look at work stored in TEAMs folders or in Google drives and on their desktops on laptops – very often they have saved multiple copies of the same document or presentation and need to clean up their digital workspaces.

In Mathematics, students will examine the big idea that what needs to be measured determines the unit of measurement. Students will be provided with opportunities to: measure and compare lengths of objects and locations using kilometres, metres, centimetres and millimetres, identify and measure the perimeter of shapes, objects and locations and read and represent analog and digital time.





We always try to make a creative Christmas centerpiece in the senior class that involves multi step processes and will start the design on those this week.

Year 6 students will be writing their speeches for their year 6 farewell, thinking back over their years at Lue Public School and what have been the stand-out moments for them.

Depending on the weather, we may head to Kandos Pool on Thursday for distance swimming practice – something we can't do in our school pool. Given that the MSSN swimming carnival is only two weeks into the new school year in 2024, we need to get that practise in!
