

Each student will receive an extra sticker on their charts towards their next merit certificate.





Thankyou to all the parents that have organised a parent/teacher interview | look forward to meeting you all and learning more about your little ones.






From the Senior Classroom

Students are so excited to be reading our class text at the moment and really enjoying this particular story as it unfolds. There is so much learning outside of just reading the text as it is set in the 1930s in Paris so there's lots of explaining of how people lived etc at that time. Their predictions of what might happen next are really good and I'm excited for them to see how close some of them are to what will actually happen.

In Spelling this week, students will be focusing on the short a phoneme, the rule of how y changes when adding a suffix and the exceptions to that rule.

Our Writing focus will be on creating sizzling starts when writing a narrative. Students will be looking at the different ways to really engage their reader from the very start to want to read on.

Our Mathematics focus is on additive relations this week. Students will continue to develop their repertoire of strategies for addition and subtraction, both mental and written.

Our History work this semester focuses on the Gold Rush and the events that led before it and then followed it to shape the Australia we know today. Students are going to be working collaboratively to research these events and create a diorama of life on the goldfields with information panels to showcase their learning. There will be an excursion to Hill End early in Term 2 that ties in with these studies.

In Visual Art last week, students learned how to use cross hatching to create shade by making a 2D circle appear to look like a 3D sphere. We will continue to develop these skills further this week.

In Science this term, students will be learning about why is it important for food and/or fibre to be produced sustainably. This week we are going to brainstorm ideas about how different foods and fibres are produced on farms, list key words and create a flow chart to show links between them.

Students know that expectations are high and when in class, I am expecting them to listen, learn, collaborate and produce the very best work that they can.
