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In the Junior class this week, students will be starting their speeches for the MSSN Public Speaking event at the end of term. They will start by planning what they will write about and build their drafts over the coming weeks. The speeches will be sent home once complete to practice at home.

In mathematics, students in kindergarten will meet Gus the Plus and Linus the Minus to build their understanding of addition and subtraction. Stage 1 students will grow their understanding and application of addition and subtraction skills.

Senior Classroom

What a fabulous day we had last Friday at Hill End where students were really able to bring their History studies to life looking at artefacts and experiencing a real mine tunnel. The students were all very excited to find some gold flakes when gold panning – that was just the icing on the cake for the day.

This week we are really diving into our class text looking at a hybrid text that provides both descriptive and factual information on the same topic. Students are learning to identify the features of the hybrid text and examine tier 1 vocabulary (every day words), tier 2 vocabulary (more powerful vocabulary eg huge instead of big) and tier 3 vocabulary (context specific words). This deep dive into the text is really going to support them when they start writing their own hybrid text.

In Mathematics this week we are looking at additive relations and, in particular, how we can use our skills of addition to support us with subtraction – inverse operations.

Our Google Classroom unit on Ned Kelly had every student focused and concentrating so well last week. I can't wait to see what they do this week!
