Thank you to those families who have already completed permission notes for the Public Speaking event on 20th June. If you have not yet done so, please do so this week so we can finalise transport arrangements.



JUNIOR CLASSROOM



In the Junior class, students are practicing hard to be ready and prepared for their public speaking event next Friday. It is really important that they are given opportunities to practice at home with anybody as ideas about presentation can be shared and students get very excited when they are encouraged by important people in their lives.

In English this Week, students will be completing progress monitoring assessments to gauge their learning and retention of new learning skills. We have been loving seeing Mr O each Monday and Wednesday morning, where he is noticing a massive improvement in each students skills especially Kindergarten and their use of sounds in words and writing simple sentences.



In mathematics, students in kindergarten are looking at how teen numbers can be represented as "10 and some more" using sticks and tens-frames. Students in years 1 & 2 are looking at vocabulary used to describe chance, and events that match definite, likely and unlikely.

Senior Classroom

Students in the senior class are studying a new text in English. They will gain greater understanding of the textual concepts of 'genre' and 'perspective and context' Through study of the text Deadly Science Wild Weather and the supporting text Cyclone by Jackie French, students are learning to apply their understanding of genre to analyse texts and identify their purpose, subject matter, form, structure and language choices. Students will be planning, composing, revising, editing and publishing a hybrid text recounting a historical extreme weather event in Australia.

In Mathematics this week, students will be revising fractions, fractions of length, shape, quantity and collections. Fractions and decimals can be tricky and through working with manipulatives and visual representations, students are able to build a greater understanding of the topic area.

The Science unit for the last few weeks of term links very nicely with the English content in that it is looking at how weather affects the Earth – eg erosion.

Knox did an awesome job last week of assembling the new bikes for school, very kindly provided by our amazing P&C with a little help from Mr McDonald. Knox's commitment to ensuring bikes are ready for students to use with tyres checked etc is very commendable. I think we need him to start training up a couple of younger students to take over this when he moves on to high school next year!
